## **Law enforcement training offered at animal welfare conference**

A daylong Friday, Sept. 16 course, designed to fill a gap in traditional law enforcement training and provide information that officers need to respond to animal-related issues in the field, will be offered as part of the Michigan Pet Fund Alliance biennial “Getting to the Goal” No Kill Conference at the Holiday Inn Gateway Centre in Flint.

Recommended primarily for law enforcement officers, the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards certified course, “Animals in the Field: Law Enforcement Training,” will be taught by Michigan Humane Society President and Chief Executive Officer Matthew Pepper and his specially trained staff.
